All programming and services of Holocaust & Human Rights Education Center are provided free of charge.* All community programs are free and open to the public. As such, we are dependent on the generosity of our supporters.

95% of our annual \$500K operating budget is funded each year by the generous contributions of individual donors. (*excludes the Educator Trip to Germany/Poland, which is subsidized)
